

We have come to the Last Supper and Jesus is speaking to his disciples and he knows he is going to be arrested in just a few hours and he knows the next day he is going to die. The disciples don't know this yet, but Jesus knows this. And as he knows this, what he is saying to the disciples is, this is the stuff I want you to remember. "Don't forget the mission. Don't forget what we were doing. Don't forget what I taught you. I am going to leave you. This really matters, I came for this."

Some background on foot washing. In the ancient Near East, people wore sandals, these sandals were opened toed. The sandals were not comfortable and people were walking on dirt roads most of the time. It is estimated that people walked around five miles a day. No arch supports, no socks on dusty roads; how do you think your feet would feel at the end of the day when you get home at night? Most likely they are tired and sore.

You walked into the home in the ancient Near East, and you took off your shoes and you walked in your bare feet. Now not only are they sore, what else are they? The smell, stink... dust, grime, sweat. When you entered the house you washed your feet, just like before you ate a meal you washed your hands. Somewhere when you entered the house there would be a basin, a pitcher and a towel. Typically, you washed your own feet. You came in, you smelled better, hopefully were refreshed, it was good hospitality for the host, it was good manners for the guests.

If you had servants or slaves, you could have one of them wash people's feet. The commentary by the rabbis said that if your servant or slave was Jewish, they couldn't wash the feet of people. It was too demeaning for a Jewish person to do this. It had to be a Gentile.

Now as Jesus and his disciples arrive at what was probably the Upper Room, preparations had been made by Jesus and the disciples for dinner. Part of those preparations would have been having a pitcher, a basin and towel at the door.

So, Jesus gets up, takes the basin, the pitcher and the towel and washes his disciple's feet.

In the culture Jesus lives in, one of the highest virtues was honor. If you had attained honor people respected you, they waited on you, they didn't expect you to play the role of a servant. You were an honored individual. Jesus turns this on its head.

He introduces a new virtue – humility. This changes things. In Judaism, in Christianity, in Western Civilization. People who expect to be waited on, we think well, okay. But if you see someone who is practicing servant leadership, who walks around asking how you are doing, you respect that person, you think that person has character. Over and over people stay where they are appreciated, where they feel respected, where they feel that they can make a difference. This started here when Jesus knelt down to wash the feet of his disciples.

The command, John 13:33-35, Jesus isn't talking about romantic or erotic love, he's not talking about the warm fuzzy feeling you get from doing something nice or good for another person. He is talking about the decision that you make to practice good to another person even if they don't deserve it. It is looking to see who is in need of compassion, kindness, mercy. Who is in need of a small touch, a great touch, who needs to be built up, lifted up particularly when they don't deserve it. Sacrificial love, and we will see the greatest example of that when Jesus dies on the cross the next day. A costly love that gives everything.

Jesus says you are blessed when you do it. Do you see yourself as a servant or are you waiting for someone else to serve you? What Jesus calls us to do is to change the world if we do it. To love like Jesus would. Jesus calls us to change the world by loving and blessed are you if you do it.



What:
